Case Studies Illustrating the Matrix in Action

Mandating Lockdowns COVID19 This decision scored high on Public Health Impact reducing transmission but also high on Individual Rights restrictions limiting movement and business operations The economic and social equity scores varied depending on the implementation and support systems in place Transparency varied widely across jurisdictions

Prioritizing Vaccine Distribution COVID19 Ethical debates raged over prioritizing vulnerable populations high Public Health Impact high Equity versus prioritizing essential workers balancing Public Health with Economic considerations Transparency in allocation criteria was crucial for building trust
