playwrights and authors who wrenched Britain out of post war austerity and paved the way for the swinging 60s and beyond everything and the kitchen sink analyses kitchen sink realism and the birth of pop cinema in the context of contemporaneous debates surrounding politics civil liberties sexuality race immigration and urbanisation covering the lives and careers of well known figures such as Alan Sillitoe Shelagh Delaney David Storey Edna O'Brien and Albert Finney as well as charting the rise of iconic British series like Coronation Street and Z Cars Simon Matthews offers a fascinating blend of social history pop culture drama and cinema Matthews also interviews contemporary figures including Ken Loach about the kitchen sink era and how it inspired their work the book will appeal to cultural studies students cineastes social historians and anyone interested in the performing arts for fans of Robert Sellers Don't Let the Bastards Grind You Down How One Generation of British Actors Changed the World and Peter Biskind's Easy Riders Raging Bulls How the Sex Drugs and Rock n Roll Generation Saved Hollywood includes a foreword by Tom Courtenay

this engaging intellectual biography traces Berger's creative evolution analyzes highlights from his vast output and situates them within his empathetic Marxism The New Yorker the first intellectual biography of the life and work of John Berger John Berger was one of the most influential thinkers and writers of postwar Europe as a novelist he won the Booker Prize in 1972 donating half his prize money to the Black Panthers as a TV presenter he changed the way we looked at art with Ways of Seeing as a storyteller and political activist he defended the rights and dignity of workers migrants and the oppressed around the world far from dragging politics into art he wrote in 1953 art has dragged me into politics he remained a revolutionary up to his death in January 2017 built around a series of watersheds at once personal and historical a writer of our time traces Berger's development from his roots as a postwar art student and polemicist in the cold war battles of 1950s London through the heady days of the 1960s when the revolutions were not only political but sexual and artistic to Berger's reinvention as a rural storyteller and the long hangover that followed the rise and fall of the New Left drawing on first hand unpublished interviews and archival sources only recently made available Joshua Sperling digs beneath the moments of controversy to reveal a figure of remarkable complexity and resilience the portrait that emerges is of a cultural innovator as celebrated as he was often misunderstood and a writer increasingly driven as much by what

he loved as by what he opposed a writer of our time brings the many faces of john berger together repatriating one of our great minds to the intellectual dramas of his and our time

this is the first book of its kind to look across disciplines at this vital aspect of british art literature and culture it brings the various intertwined histories of social realism into historical perspective and argues that this sometimes marginalized genre is still an important reference point for creativity in britain

alex seago s book has been inspired by his desire to understand and discover the origins of postmodern culture in britain one of the main points of his study is that it was art and design students who were among the first to be aware of and to articulate social implications of postmodern culture arguing that postwar art schools provided a vital crucible for the development of a particularly english cultural sensibility he focuses on cultural change at the royal college of art london during the 1950s and 1960s the students attack on the english box of beautiful things a term used by a former student to describe the neo romantic neo victorian highly decorated tastes of some rca tutors took several forms which eventually resulted in the pop art produced by the 1959 62 generation boshier phillips jones hockney et al alex seago traces the emergence of english postmodernism through the pages of ark the journal of the royal college of art interviewing ark s editors art editors and contributors including len deighton novelist and art editor of ark 10 clifford hatts student at the rca 1946 8 and later head of the design group bbc peter blake rca painting school 1953 6 robyn denny rca painting school 1954 7 ark s object of enquiry remained the elusive but necessary relationships between the arts and the social context throughout its twenty five year history making it a valuable archive for the cultural historian in its most memorable issues ark s layouts complemented the contents to produce distillations of the energy and enthusiasm of the period under review

a groundbreaking and extensively researched account of the 1960s london art scene in the 1960s london became a vibrant hub of artistic production postwar reconstruction jet air travel television arts programs new color supplements a generation of young artists dealers and curators the influx of international film companies the projection of creative britain as a national brand all nurtured and promoted the emergence of london as a new capital of art

extensively illustrated and researched this book offers an unprecedented rich account of the social field that constituted the lively london scene of the 1960s in clear fluent prose tickner presents an innovative sequence of critical case studies each of which explores a particular institution or event in the cultural life of london between 1962 and 1968 the result is a kaleidoscopic view of an exuberant decade in the history of british art

during the years following world war ii debates about the british landscape fused with questions of national identity as the country reconstructed its sense of self for better or for worse artists statesmen and ordinary citizens saw themselves reflected in the landscape and in turn helped to shape the way that others envisioned the land while landscape art is frequently imagined in terms of painting this book examines the role of landscape in terms of a broader definition of visual culture to include the discussion not only of works of oil on canvas but also prints sculpture photography advertising fashion journalism artists biographies and the multi media stage of the national exhibition making extensive use of archival materials newspaper reviews radio broadcasts interviews with artists letters and exhibition planning documents catherine jolivet explores the intersection of landscape art with a variety of discourses including the role of women in contemporary society the status of immigrant artists in britain developments in science and technology and the promotion of british art and culture abroad

martin gayford s masterful account of painting in london from the second world war to the 1970s illustrated by documentary photographs and the works themselves the development of painting in london from the second world war to the 1970s has never before been told before as a single narrative r b kitaj s proposal made in 1976 that there was a substantial school of london was essentially correct but it caused confusion because it implied that there was a movement or stylistic group at work when in reality no one style could cover the likes of francis bacon and also bridget riley modernists and mavericks explores this period based on an exceptionally deep well of firsthand interviews often unpublished with such artists as victor pasmore john craxton lucian freud frank auerbach allen jones r b kitaj euan uglow howard hodgkin terry frost gillian ayres bridget riley david hockney frank bowling leon kossoff john hoyland and patrick caulfield but martin gayford also teases out the thread weaving these

individual lives together and demonstrates how and why long after it was officially declared dead painting lived and thrived in london simultaneously aware of the influences of jackson pollock giacometti and through the teaching passed down at the major art school the traditions of western art from piero della francesca to picasso and matisse the postwar painters were bound by their confidence that this ancient medium could do fresh and marvelous things and explored in their diverse ways the possibilities of paint

this delightfully eclectic book part comedy part travelogue and part cultural history uncovers the story of the british delegations that were invited to china in 1954 a full eighteen years before president nixon s more famous 1972 mission

met lit opg met reg the author argues that the rupture of post modernism with the critical culture of modernism realism and marxism is in the light of the still determining power of many of the aims and concerns of the modernist and realist projects also included is a description of the production distribution and criticism of the visual arts in britain since the late 1970s and the rise of thatcherism

this dictionary consists of over 3000 entries on a range of british artists from medieval manuscript illuminators to contemporary cartoonists its core is comprised of the entries focusing on british graphic artists and illustrators from the 2006 benedit dictionary of artists with an additional 90 revised and 60 new articles

the techniques utilized however varied the americans generally used a more reductive method arriving at a centralized iconic image while the british preferred an episodic approach that generated an implied narrative as the essays in this book make clear pop art promoted no specific agenda beyond the investigation of the prevailing american environment book jacket

as in austerity britain an astonishing array of vivid intimate and unselfconscious voices drive the narrative the keen eyed nella last shops assiduously at barrow market as austerity and rationing gradually give way to relative abundance housewife judy haines relishing the detail of suburban life brings up her children in chingford the self absorbed civil servant henry st

john perfects the art of grumbling these and many other voices give a rich unsentimental picture of everyday life in the 1950s we also encounter well known figures on the way such as doris lessing joining and later leaving the communist party john arlott sticking up on any questions for the rights of homosexuals and tiger s roy of the rovers making his goal scoring debut for melchester all this is part of a colourful unfolding tapestry in which the great national events the tories returning to power the death of george vi the coronation of queen elizabeth the sues crisis jostle alongside everything that gave britain in the 1950s its distinctive flavour butlin s holiday camps kenwood food mixers hancock s half hour ekco television sets davy crockett skiffle and teddy boys deeply researched david kynaston s family britain offers an unrivalled take on a largely cohesive ordered still very hierarchical society gratefully starting to move away from the painful hardships of the 1940s towards domestic ease and affluence

in this book gregory salter traces how artists represented home and masculinities in the period of social and personal reconstruction after the second world war in britain salter considers home as an unstable entity at this historical moment imbued with the optimism and hopes of post war recovery while continuing to resonate with the memories and traumas of wartime artists examined in the book include john bratby francis bacon keith vaughan francis newton souza and victor pasmore case studies featured range from the nuclear family and the body to the nation combined they present an argument that art enables an understanding of post war reconstruction as a temporally unstable long term phenomenon which placed conceptions of home and masculinity at the heart of its aims art and masculinity in post war britain sheds new light on how the fluid concepts of society nation masculinity and home interacted and influenced each other at this critical period in history and will be of interest to anyone studying art history anthropology sociology history and cultural and heritage studies

deals with the difficult condition in london publishing and british literary life in the 1940s the leading novelists and poets in the postwar years the arrival of the angry young men in the theatre in the mid 1950s and the revival of british painting in these years

andrew forge was an english painter and a teacher of painting yale university 1975 1994 renowned and respected on both sides of the atlantic but he was also known for his writing on the arts spanning almost fifty years which was admired for the delicacy and openness of

his language and the ways in which he thought about the processes of perception in all their sensual possibilities the selection here of his writings is intended to show the range of his interests and the particularly personal interpretations he brought to all he saw in an art with which he was so passionately engaged it is also a fascinating record of the arts that were of concern in the years he wrote from the work of rubens to that of rauschenberg and frankenthaler as well as especially in his last essays the work of his many friends and associates kenneth martin euan uglow jake berthot william bailey and graham nickson

dick watkins belongs to the generation of artists whose careers were launched at the high flying end of american based abstraction almost immediately he faced up to the abrupt end of the modern era culture was no longer to be framed by progress in 1970 taking stock of the situation he announced that he was a copyist there being no such thing as a new creation in art shaped as it was by visual languages nor did he intend to limit his curiosity about the relation of art to life by restricting himself to a personal style there followed a long and passionately adventurous exploration into many subjects and styles during which watkins was often the first to signal changes taking place in western culture the result is that for half a century he has been a major if controversial figure in australian art

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begins with a series of lectures in which fuller outlines his ideas and his debt to john ruskin ensuing essays examine the nature of the british tradition looking at work from reynolds and stubbs to auerbach and hockney he also reassesses british modernists such as sutherland bacon and piper

lavishly illustrated catalogue of the world renowned artists and designers associated with the

royal college of art london arguably the most influential art and design school in the world

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
